To the Church of Jesus Christ in Dover,

Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

Just before Christmas, Marie-Laure and I had a wood stove installed in our living room fireplace. Heating with wood has been a long-term dream of mine, beginning way back in the first Oil Crisis of the 1970s when our nation started talking about environmental consciousness and the danger of reliance on foreign oil. When I came to Dover and learned that our church had a wood lot off Pine Street for the pastor's use dating from the early days of our church, my dream started to look not only possible, but likely.

My initial impulse towards heating with wood was one glamorizing self reliance and living locally. After our first winter in the parsonage, it was also one of habitability. The parsonage is both old and poorly insulated with exceptionally inefficient windows, which means that the downstairs front of the house was not comfortable during the colder months. Last year, we essentially closed the doors to the front living room and my study, sealing in the cold as it were, and lived upstairs and in the back of the house for the winter. I reasoned that a wood stove would allow us to enjoy our living room this winter, and I was right. It is lovely, warm and charming with a fire burning.

More important however has been the spiritual lessons I have learned in the last month of heating with wood. Between all the cutting and chopping and stacking and carrying which a wood stove requires, not to mention the fact that our wood stove is small and relatively quick burning, which means that we have to check regularly and feed it often, I have become intensely mindful of what heating our house entails in terms of human effort, material consumption, and waste disposal. When it was only a matter of going over to the thermostat and making adjustments now and then, it never really crossed my mind how much energy we were consuming to live comfortably. I never even really saw the oil bills, which went to the Trustees. Now I know exactly, so many logs an hour, so big a pile a day, moved from the woodpile in the backyard to the front steps and gradually through the front door and to the hearth as needed.

Jesus taught a spirituality of mindfulness, of being aware of the world around us and how we are in the world. Our modern way of life makes it challenging for us to live mindfully when we just pull into a gas station and fill up when we're running low, or hop over to Needham for some fresh oranges in January when the craving hits, not thinking of the fossil fuels used to grow and transport those five oranges from Florida to my table. And the list goes on: lighting, clothing, recreation, everything. It's just there for people like us who have the money to buy what we want when we want it.

That little black wood stove slows me down and gets me thinking about how many trees I needed to heat my house, how many hours it took me to make them burnable, the gas for the chain saw, and so on. My lilacs are going to love the ash waste in the Spring, but what about the smoke going up the chimney right now?

I offer this as an example of mindful living. Loading wood into our stove is a spiritual exercise for me. Shopping for, preparing and eating a meal can be too. Buying clothes as well. I invite all of us to live more mindfully in God's creation. It is good for the life of the world and good for your soul.

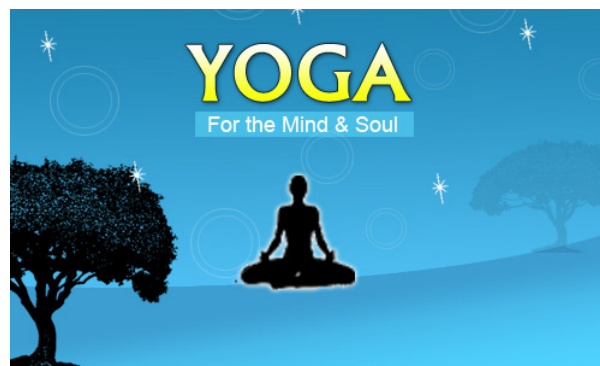
