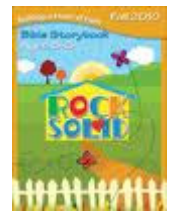

### The Dover Church 250th Casserole

#### Chicken Artichoke Bake 36 servings

**10lbs. Bnls. Skinless Chicken (breast and thighs)**

**2 stlks. celery**

**1 onion**

**1T curry**

**1T ginger**

**1tsp. salt**

**1tsp. pepper**

Place chicken, vegs. & seasonings in a large stock pot. Cover with water. Bring to a boil, reduce heat, and simmer for 20-25 mins. Remove immediately from the pot and cool. It should be slightly undercooked. Cut into bite-size pieces.

**1 lg. box (18 serv.) Mid-East rice pilaf**

Cook in chicken stock. Season with ginger and curry.

**2 C chopped red onion**

**1T wet garlic**

**4 C 1/4'd artichoke hearts**

**2 C slivered almonds**

**1/2 C chopped red pepper (optin.)**

In a large sautee pan, melt 1/4lb. butter. Add garlic, cook over a low heat for several mins. Add onion, cook until golden and soft. Add the almonds and artichokes, cook several mins. longer. Stir in 1tsp. ea. thyme, curry, salt and pepper, a cup of white wine and a dash of worcestershire sauce. Simmer together for 5 mins., then remove from heat.

**2 cans cream soup (chicken or celery)**

**1C Mayo**

In a large mixing bowl, combine the chicken, rice, and veggies.

Add soup, sour cream, & mayo. Mix well. If the mixture seems dry, add reserved chicken stock and/or white wine.

Turn into a full hotel pan. Sprinkle with parmesan cheese. Cover completely with the grapenut topping.

Cover with foil; bake in a 375° oven for 45 mins. Uncover and bake until brown on top (appr. 15 mins.)

**Grapenut topping**

**1lb. melted butter/margarine**

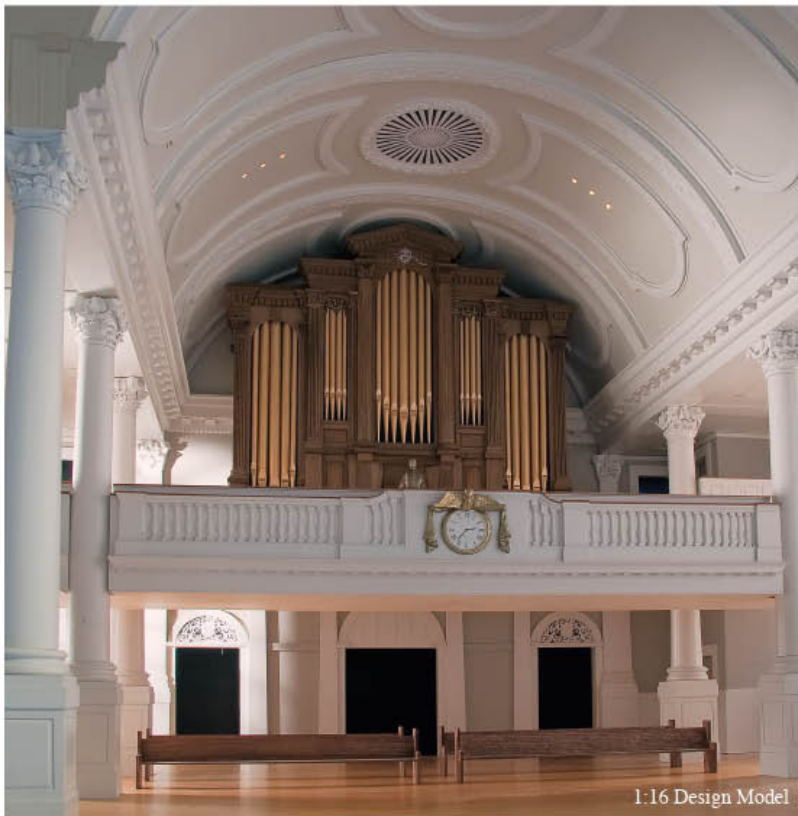
**6C grapenut flakes**

**2C Slivered Almonds**

**1C Parmesan cheese**

**1/2C white wine**
