To The Church in Dover,

May grace and peace be yours from God our Creator and our Lord Jesus Christ!

More than a fifteen months ago, three men in our church started getting together for lunch every Friday: myself, Dave Melville and Jim MacDonald. We were going to be my first "small group" at The Dover Church, a gathering to talk about faith, share our lives, and listen for God. It soon became clear that our group was not going to be a "traditional" group, in that our conversations always came back to a desire to do something, to find a way to let our faith speak through action. We wanted to do something transformative, both for ourselves and for the people and community we would work with. We wanted our mission to be inter-generational, something we could involve our children in. We wanted our mission to be something that we could share with our church as an invitation for wider participation. And we wanted whatever we did to be both meaningful, substantive, and sustainable. No "One-offs." No disaster tourism. No "feel good throw away gestures."

And we met and had lunch, week after week, as we threw out ideas, did research, talked with people, and focused our thinking. Barry Fougere joined us and brought his vision to the table. When the earthquake hit Haiti a year ago, we started to turn our attention towards the overwhelming need for hands and hearts. We began to plan an exploratory trip, first with our brothers and sisters at St. Dunstan's Church across the street, and then with an organization called the St. Boniface Haiti Foundation, a group from the South Shore who run a hospital in Haiti. Jim's father had been one of the prime movers in starting this group and Jim himself had served there in his twenties. Then Dave heard about a woman from Dover named Elizabeth Sheehan who was turning abandoned shipping containers into medical clinics. We met with Paul from St. Boniface. We met with Liz. We didn't get to go to Haiti because of the political unrest there. We met with both Paul and Liz and Conor, also from St. Boniface, and now they are working together.

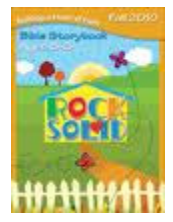

High School Youth Group

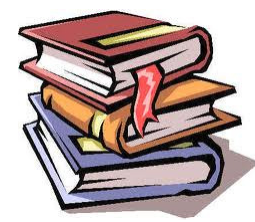
