*“Everyone then who hears these words of mine and acts on them will be like a wise man who built his house on rock.”

With the help of previous Sunday School teachers and discussions with other CE Directors in the area, **Rock Solid** by Cokesbury has been chosen as our curriculum for grades Pre-K to 5th grade. **Reel to Real** will be used for our older students in grades 6, 7, and 8. **Rock Solid** is built around stories from the Bible. For children to form a lasting relationship with the Bible we have to get them into it. As our children grow we will help them develop skills that will unlock the Bible’s messages for them. The development editors of **Rock Solid** recognize that children “know” that which they have “experienced” and processed. In order for children to have faith and build a relationship with God they have to experience what this faith is like and see it lived out in the adults around them.



Reel to Real is a Bible-based exploration of issues facing youth through the medium of modern and classic movies. Movies are selected which both interest youth and which offer insights and exploration into life and faith and where they intersect. Reel to Real promotes discussion, fellowship, and community among the youth as they view and discuss the films in conjunction with selected Biblical passages that tie in with the theme of the movie.



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In September, all our children will have lessons about communion. Through the suggestion of previous teachers and also members of the CE Committee, we will be sampling the “stations” model of Sunday School with a curriculum created by Rev. Deborah Alberswerth Payden. These lessons are being offered because on Sunday, October 3rd, which is **World Wide Communion Sunday**, all our students will be invited to share in communion with their families. A letter detailing this worship service will be sent to all families with Sunday School age children.

It is our hope that through these lessons the children will have a better understanding of this sacrament in our faith tradition.



During October and November our **Rock Solid** curriculum presents lessons from the Old Testament on the lives of Jacob and his son Joseph, the growing of God’s family and the Hope for God’s people.

After Thanksgiving we enter the season of Advent – a season of preparation and waiting for the Christ child’s birth. The children will be talking about Advent, Jesus’ birth and preparing for a Christmas pageant.

Sunday School Curriculum

Sunday School curriculum will begin on September 18 and run through June 12th which will be Children’s Sunday. Our theme this year asks the question “What’s in your Faith Toolbox?” Throughout the year during Sunday School this question will be asked and answered. The year will center around “the tools of faith.”

Sunday School will be offered **every** Sunday throughout the year. On the holiday weekends all classes of Sunday School will be combined into a class called **Kids in Mission**. These classes will focus on mission projects done by the children. For example, letters/cards could be written to our soldiers overseas, small decorative pieces could be made for the meal trays at a VA hospital, or perhaps some project which would allow our children to interact with the children who come to us through the IHN project. Regular Sunday School teachers will not be expected to lead these classes unless they wish. Members of the Sunday School team will be leading these projects with other interested volunteers.

Restoration Committee Update

The Restoration Committee has been hard at work since last spring. Here is a quick update:

1. **May:** A newly expanded Restoration Committee met to decide the order of work to be done, based on both the "Wish List" approved by the congregation and Trustees, as well as by the amount of funds currently raised. The committee decided the following:
 - a. Due to the pre-school tenant and our Sunday School not being in session, work on lower Kraft Hall should be done during the summer months. A "Sunday School Sub Committee" was formed, consisting of Laura Wood, Anne Carter, Sally Shoemaker, Emilia Halstead and Kim Cone.
 - b. A "Decorating Committee" was also formed at this time, consisting of Lee Graham, Sally Shoemaker, Dale Cabot, Sara Jo Marble and Kim Cone. The goal of the Decorating Committee was to not only study the overall color scheme of the church, with its first goal being paint color recommendations for lower Kraft Hall, but to make furniture and carpet recommendations for this area, as well. It was decided that the color scheme currently in place in both the sanctuary and Kraft Hall would only be freshened, not changed dramatically.
 - c. As the result of an extensive energy audit coordinated by Bill Barrett and Chris Newport last winter, designated repairs/adjustments to the heating system were also approved at this time.
 - d. Also approved was the work to be done on the sanctuary carrying wall, due to the summer being the optimal time for this work, as well. Betty Brady offered to coordinate this work.
 - e. Finally, the committee approved a glass door for Max' office, which is required under "Safe Church" policies, as well as new furniture and paint for Emilia's new office.

2. **May and June:**

- a. The Sunday School Sub Committee met once a week to review in great detail the usage of lower Kraft Hall with the goal of fine tuning the details of the proposed renovation. The group also toured the Wellesley Congregational Church to view another recent renovation. A "Building Specification" sheet was developed for the two contractors bidding on the project. This sub committee also worked tirelessly to clean out the Sunday School rooms. Assisting with the final clean out was Peter Wier and two friends of Emilia's from seminary school. *(cont. on p. 7)*

b. The Decorating Committee met on a weekly basis starting in June, looking at a multitude of paint and carpet samples that might be considered in all areas of the church.

c. Emilia's office was completed.

3. July:

a. The Sunday School Sub Committee met with the larger Restoration Committee and Trustees to make a recommendation to hire Peter Halkett as the contractor of choice for the lower Kraft Hall project. Both the Restoration Committee and Trustees approved the hiring of Peter Halkett. Peter started work on July 30th, with much progress already having been made by the end of the first week of August.

b. The Decorating Committee made paint, carpet and furniture decisions for lower Kraft Hall.

c. Thanks to Betty Brady, work on the carrying wall, which includes both exterior and interior construction, has almost been completed.

d. The replacement of Max' door was also completed.

e. The work on the heating system has been scheduled to be completed before the end of the summer.

4. Going forward:

a. The Restoration Committee will meet again in early September to review the next segment of the "Wish List" to be completed, once again based on funds raised and the church schedule.

My very sincere gratitude to all committee members who took time from their summer schedules to expedite the work to be done on the church. The work is exciting, but the camaraderie and friendships made during this process is valuable beyond measure.
