Following the bombing of the Boston Marathon on April 15, 2013, I have been spending a lot of time reflecting on our faith resources for moving forward into the future. To summarize here, I am going to run the Boston Marathon next year as a statement about life and the human spirit. In this coming year of training, I am going to use the discipline of running to learn about the ministries of peace making, practicing non-violence, fostering reconciliation and restorative justice, all central Christian vocations. My hope is that in my learning I will have much to share with all of you. My hope in my hope is that you will hear your calling to some ministry of peace and justice and that together we can labor on. After all, every time we pray the Lord's Prayer, "thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven," this is what we are praying for, that we might become the answer to our prayers.

Each of us has some way to add to the peace, love, justice, joy, community and reconciliation of the world for which all of us long...if not for ourselves, then at least for our children and grandchildren. I have not figured out how I am going to share what I learn with all of you, but it will probably be on my blog, through Facebook, here in our newsletter, and from the pulpit. If you have ever wished that there was something you could do to make the world a better place, I pray that this year we will all find our unique calling.

### Cycle the WAVE



Last month The Dover Church Lunch Bunch hosted Judy Mongiardo from Family Promise (formerly MetroWest Interfaith Hospitality) in order to learn more about the organization and how The Dover Church and Lunch Bunch could further support FP in addition to the quarterly hosting of families. Judy touched on several ways that our church members could further help out Family Promise:

During the month of April, The Lunch Bunch will be collecting items for the Family Promise Day Center. The Day Center is home base for Family Promise families. It is where they live when not at work or school and on weekends. It is where they shower, do laundry, conduct job searches and just relax. Items needed are as follows:

#### **Personal Items:**

Toothbrushes, toothbrush holders, toothpaste, deodorant, brush/combs, chapstick, floss, soap, hand cream, razors, shampoos, toilet paper, overnight bags and towels.

### Other items:

Paper towels, tissues, zip lock bags (qt or 1gal), sandwich bags, plastic wrap, napkins, disposable cups, bowls plates, plastic ware and trash bags (30g and 13g).

There will be a box in Kraft Hall center hall through the month of April. Please consider donating items to help this worthy organization.

## MUSIC FROM VENICE ON MOTHER'S DAY

On Sunday morning, May 12, Mother's Day, we will gather as an expanded choir, with organ and two violins, for the 10:00 worship service to sing *Gloria* by Antonio Vivaldi. I would like anyone who has sung in the choir, who has thought about singing in the choir, or should be singing in the choir to join us that day and for the rehearsals leading up to it. This is your chance to experience being in the choir with a short term commitment, a chance to get to know your fellow parishioners, and have **fun singing beautiful music together in a Sunday** morning worship service. The rehearsal schedule is:

Thursday, April 25 7:30-9 pm Saturday, April 27 9-11 am Thursday, May 2 7:30-9 pm Saturday, May 4 9-11 am Thursday, May 9 7-9 pm

Antonio Vivaldi composed this Gloria in Venice, probably in 1715, for the choir of the Ospedale della Pietà, an orphanage for girls. Vivaldi, a priest, music teacher and virtuoso violinist, composed many sacred works for the Ospedale, where he spent most of his career, as well as hundreds of instrumental concertos to be played by the girls' orchestra. This, his most famous choral piece, presents the traditional Gloria from the Latin Mass in twelve varied cantata-like sections.
