News from Meeting House Hill

To the sisters and brother in Christ in Dover:

May the peace of God which passes all understanding and the love God in Christ Jesus our Lord guard your hearts and minds.

I want to thank the church for the gift of sabbath this summer. Those four weeks along with my vacation weeks were a tonic for my soul.

One of the things that plagues all of our souls, in my humble opinion, is the lack of opportunity for sabbath in our lives. I say lack of opportunity, but perhaps it would be more accurate to call it the temptation or social pressure to skip sabbath. God knows the human soul and offered us the commandment to keep sabbath, but so often we put so much else first, to our own spiritual detriment.

Not to date myself, and this may be just for the benefit of the under 50 crowd who won't have lived in "the old days," but sabbath keeping was serious business in my childhood and youth. They're called them the blue laws now, but back then it was just the air we breathed that everything except Jewish bakeries and markets was closed on Sundays, and the Jews closed at noon. Of course, looking back now I realize that the Jews got a raw deal in that everything happened on Friday night and Saturday morning. It never occurred to me that my teammates were missing their Shabbat when we played in Friday night high school basketball and football games.

I lift up the Jews because I am not one of those Christian pastors who insist that we ought to go back to the good old days and close everything down on Sundays. No, but I do think we, all of us, people of faith or not, ought to take a break of one seventh a week. We should seek to redesign our lives so that is a possibility rather than a dream.

Sundays in my childhood consisted of church, visiting with my grandparents, aunts and uncles, and a substantial supper in the middle of the afternoon that was more formal than Wednesday nights. Plenty of our neighbors didn't go to church or had gone to shabbat services the day before, but everyone's Sundays were a lot like ours, full of a lot of doing nothing...except for my mother who had to get the fancy supper ready.

I remember feeling bored and wishing I could go play with my friends. I remember feeling constrained by the more formal clothes I wore all day, as opposed to my school or play clothes. But I also re-

I did not get everything done I had planned to do this summer. I did write, but only about a fifth of what I had sketched out. I did run, but I did not get in the mileage to run the marathon I thought I might run on October 1 (I learned a lot running the last marathon and I am not heading across the starting line again without putting in the mileage). I read about three of the books in my stack of twenty. We did have friends and neighbors over for dinner parties, and vice versa, but not all that much. I did get all my projects done on our house and yard. God help me, I didn't even do half of the fishing I had imagined doing. And yet, that was the rhythm of this summer's sabbath.

I cannot claim to be "full of beans" the way I was on Monday mornings 50 years ago, but I fuller than I was three months ago, and for that, I thank you and God.,

Now come to church and let's celebrate and worship together again as the church!

We plan to add n 8:30 am Thursday morning class starting in November. Come start your day with some stretching and mindfulness.


Prayer Chapel


Family Promise Event
