ing our annual Stewardship Campaign in the fall. The campaign will begin on November 6th and run through 3 consecutive Sundays, ending after our Agape service on November 20th. During this time, we invite you to consider your blessings, as well as the ways in which The Dover Church has served your spiritual needs, as you determine your ability to offer financial support to the church in 2023. Packets including pledge cards will be mailed on November 5th and will also be available in the narthex and pews beginning on the 6th. As a reminder, during our stewardship season, we are asking only for your pledge; although pre-payments are always welcome, you do not need to begin fulfilling your pledge until 2023, in installments the timing of which may be chosen by you. Detailed information on how to pledge and make payments will be included on the pledge cards in your packets.

It has been a blessing to see the generosity of our congregation during covid, and we are fortunate that this support allowed the work of our church to continue and reach so many even when we were "shut down". As we emerge into a period of welcome renewal and reconnecting, the church's offerings and outreach are continuing to grow, but this growth as well as post-covid challenges require continued strong fiscal support from the congregation.

Stewardship is crucial to the funding of the operating budget that allows us to work, worship and continue outreach successfully. Please join in pledging with thanksgiving and joy in the knowledge that your generosity allows The Dover Church to continue God's work with fruitfulness and vitality!
