To the gathering of Resurrection people in Dover:

Grace and peace from our Lord Jesus the Christ and God our Creator!

Lent is upon us, that season of the year that falls so conveniently in what I always feel is an in between time of the non-church year. Winter is coming to an end in late February and Spring will come around Easter. Parenting Spirituality Group, March 12th, 11:20-12:20

We are trying a new thing and we hope that you will be part of it!

The everyday work, frustrations, and blessings of parenting is one of the major practices that dominates the lives of those who have children. This group aims to explore the spiritual dimensions of that work and make space for peer support and skill sharing. We hope to create a non-judgmental space for parents to share experience and questions as they dip their toes into approaching the work of parenting with mindfulness and intention. We will pull from a variety of religious, spiritual, and mindfulness traditions as we think about how being a parent informs our spirits and how we can bring spirituality to bear in parenting. We hope to explore how folks can continue to be individual persons with interests and goals even as they parent, and support each other in the tensions that inevitably leads to.
