To the church of Jesus Christ in Dover:

Here we are. The beginning of another program year at The Dover Church. The beginning of another school year for families in that demographic. For me, this is the 14th time I have come to this time of new beginnings both at The Dover Church and with the school year. We're down to one sophomore at home now, but the threshold seems familiar.

When I think back on those fourteen years, I can remember a lot of facts, but mostly I remember the feelings. There were feelings of real excitement, like preparing for a race or an athletic season and all the exciting competitions I was going to be part of. It felt like I was entering either an intensified training period or the time to put my training to the test. This is going to be the greatest Fall of all time! Other years it felt like the bends. Now I have never had the bends, but I have heard them described, when a diver ascends too rapidly from deep water to shallow and the decompression messes everything up. Except, here in Dover with the school and sports and activities and church, it was not decompression, but compression. It was like I was getting squeezed when I looked at the calendar and my energy. "Can I get this done? Just make it to Christmas?" And I would want to be back in summer, with that slower, relaxed rhythm of life. Always, it has felt joyous...even with the bends. To see everyone who has been away. To meet new people. To walk through the weeks of

church, coffee hour, and all the rest.

The last few years, however, I find myself coming to Labor Day wondering to myself, "what new thing is God going to do with us? Through us? To us? Among us?" Because there have been so many new things over the years. I look out at the gathering of God's people and realize that I am pastoring the second and a half church I have pastored here on our little hill. The vast majority of the people who were here when I came have departed, the second wave rolled in and is also half gone, and a new wave is rolling in. 

Bible Study to Begin Again - Wednesdays

Two of the promises I made at my ordination to Christian ministry in the United Church of Christ were, first, "to accept the word of God as the rule of Christian faith and practices," and second, "to be diligent in reading the scriptures."

As a pastor called to ministry in a local church, I further promised upon my Installation to keep these promises with the local church, i.e., YOU.

I know that Bible Study is not for everyone and that everyone's schedule cannot synch up with mine, but I wanted to make a pitch for what I do when leading Bible Study.

As a former professor of languages and literature, with a B.A. in History and training in Biblical Greek and Hebrew, and a Masters of Divinity, I am most interested in what the Bible says in its historical context, what it can teach us about God, Christ, the Holy Spirit, ourselves, being the church, and the meaning of life. I am not a literalist, but I do like to really read the full text rather than cherry pick verses that give me the answers I want.

I also do not do topical Bible Studies, like studying all the verses that tell Men how to be Men or Women how to be Women, and so on.

Right now, I have a thirst to either deep dive into one of the major prophets like Isaiah, Jeremiah

or Ezekiel, preferably one of the first two, or to read my way through the letters of Paul chronologically, starting with Thessalonians, which scholars think is the earliest letter, and. ending with Romans.

I am open to either. So, if you would like to join Bible Study, let me know your preference. Also, I can do Bible Study **Wednesdays at 10 or 2**. We meet on zoom, which makes it just about as accessible as it could possibly be.

Diaper Drive for A Place to Turn

In honor of National Diaper Need Awareness Week, we are collecting disposable diapers between **September 17th-October 8th** to support A Place to Turn's Diaper Project. Hawaii Wildfire Relief Effort

The devastating Hawaiian wildfires in August burned over 2,000 acres in the historic city of Lahaina as well as hundreds of acres in Kula and Olinda on the island of Maui. More than 100 people are known to have died in the wildfires and more than 11,000 have been evacuated. A staggering number of homes and businesses have been destroyed.
