<u>Grief Workshop Returns on Wednesday, October</u> 2, 10-11 AM

Last year, we began a group to talk about our griefs at the church. We had to take a break during my sabbatical, but I would like to begin again.

In this group, we share stories of our lives,

listen to one another, and delve into books that we may find helpful. Perhaps the greatest gift of this group is the safe space where we are able to put into words our deepest discord. People grieve losses of all kinds: a spouse or family member, an unwanted change in life, memories. The main point of this group is to remove any stigma from grief as a weakness or something to get better from. We are trying to integrate our grief and move forward into this new life.

I decided to try Wednesday mornings, as Sundays are quite literally too busy now with everything going on at the church. If you would like to be part of this group but cannot come on Wednesday mornings, please let me know and we'll see what we can do with scheduling. It may be possible to do a hybrid with people zooming in from home, but I think presence is essential, as one of the core components of so many of our griefs is the enormity of absence.

Saging starts this month, Wednesday, October 9, 9:30-10:30 AM

To quote last month's newsletter, "Saging" (comes from) from the word "sage" which means "wisdom or being a wise person." I would like to meet monthly to investigate various spiritual practices so that interested people can tap into their inner wisdom as well as the wisdom of our faith. We wilk seek to either discover something new that works for them, reinvigorate something they had left behind, but basically connect or reconnect with the divine within each of us. When I say spiritual practices, I mean some of the ones everyone thinks about: Mindfulness and prayer, praying the Bible, etc. But I want this to be expansive, so there will be sessions devoted to walking in nature, water color painting, ceramics, managing our calendars, writing our spiritual autobiographies, etc. We have several gifted artists in our congregation and I hope to elicit leadership from others who have a practice (say gardening) that feeds their soul.

October's theme will be gratitude or thanksgiving. We will discuss practices that will nurture a thorough sense of gratitude, as well as investigate how we came to have our glass half full or glass half empty way of going through life.

As with the Grief Workshop, I have chosen Wednesday mornings once a month for this group. If you would like to participate but cannot

on Wednesdays, please let me know and we'll look into better scheduling.

In September we had our first "Wonder Wednesday," our after school program for elementary schoolers on their half days! During our program, we ate a lunch of grilled cheese and tomato soup and enjoyed music class with Christine before diving into our theme of the day - "God takes care of us," explored through the story of Passover in the Book of Exodus. Our children helped us act out the biblical

story, then broke up in teams to race to build pyramids out of cups while blindfolded! We went back to biblical times and learned about a traditional Seder meal, tasting the different ele-





ments of a table and learning the meaning behind each one. We then crafted our own special Elijah cups with rhinestones, sequence and pompoms. We also learned about ancient

Egyptian papyrus, making our own version and decoding messages written in hieroglyphics.

Parenting and the Spirit Spirituality Group for Parents of All Ages & Stages Sunday, October 6th, 11:15 AM-12:15 PM

The everyday work, frustrations, and blessings of parenting is one of the major practices that dominates the lives of those who have children. This group aims to explore the spiritual dimensions of that work and make space for peer support and skill sharing. We hope to create a non-judgmental space for parents to share experience and questions as they approach the work of parenting with mindfulness and intention. We will pull from a variety of religious, spiritual, and mindfulness traditions as we think about how being a parent informs our spirits and how we can bring spirituality to bear in parenting. We hope to explore how folks can continue to be individual persons with interests and goals even as they parent, and support each other in the tensions that inevitably leads to.

This will be a laid back gathering, meeting monthly, with loosely-guided small group discussion, open to parents of all ages and stages! Childcare will be available during our meeting, and we will share a simple soup and bread lunch.

This month, our discussion will center on "lessons learned." So much of parenting is concerned with what and how we teach our children. What manners are they learning at the dinner table? What summer camps will help them grow their skills? What do we want them to learn in Sunday School? But our children are not the only ones learning in our family relationships. Becoming a parent is a constant journey of learning and growth. Many times, becoming a parent, and parenting our children, teaches us more about ourselves than we would have anticipated. In this gathering, we'll discuss what we have learned from parenting, and what our children have taught us - about the world, about our faith, and about ourselves.

Members of the Marin Alvarez family were excited to make the move to their new apartment on Saturday, September 14. Carlson Crossing West is a newly renovated, subsidized housing complex in Framingham that has just started accepting new tenants.

The move means a substantially lower monthly rent for Zuly and Alejandro's family as well as the added benefit of being located on a public bus route. The unit is certainly very compact in size, but the family is thrilled to have gained a third bedroom and a small, private storage/laundry basement area.

Another Diaper Drive for A Place to Turn

In honor of National Diaper Need Awareness Week, the Mission in Action committee is once again collecting disposable diapers of all sizes and baby wipes between September 29 and October 20 to support A Place to Turn's Diaper Project. 
Upcoming Publication about The Dover Church
