News from Meeting House Hill

To the church of Christ in Dover:

May the blessings of Advent, hope, peace, faith and joy, be abundant in your lives as we enter the season of Epiphany!

What do you hope to achieve in this New Year? What do you hope for? Look forward to? Are planning for? Counting on?

And what do you fear in this New Year? What makes you dread the months ahead? What are you hoping doesn't happen?

So much of our lives happens because of what our expectations or fears are going in. I know that sounds sort of "wishful thinking" new agey philosophy babble, but it's true, when you think about it. If you cannot imagine something, how can you possibly see it when it comes your way? If you are terrified of something, how can you see what it really is if your eyes are cast down in terror?

I try not to use too many flyfishing analogies in my church work for fear of coming across as a tired old saw, but one of the first things I learned when I learned to fly fish was not how to cast or what fly to use, but how to see the fish. Trout are marvelously evolved fish, perfect for the unique environment each of them habitates. Their colors and lines and spots and body shape blend them right into the flow of the water, the ripples in the surface, the browns and grays and greens of the bottom. If you don't look for a trout, the way a kingfisher looks for a trout, by staring intently at a stretch of water where you know a trout "ought to be," you'll never see the fish. But given time, the trout will move and you see the underside, or opens it's mouth and you see the flash of white, or the sun will shine in a certain way so you suddenly see the fish's shadow on the bottom and then, what was once fishless, barren water is now a place of real possibility.

My hope for all of you is that you might indulge yourself in some Biblical hope and fear in the coming year. Rather than hearing only what the politicians, cable networks, internet influencers, and newspaper editors tell you to hope for and fear, you might return to the touch-

We will also have a bus that will bring our Fox Hill Village congregants to The Dover Church on , **Sunday**, **January 26th**. Check with the front desk for departure time.


Annual Meeting

Stewardship 2025

Stewardship 2025 99 families submitted their pledges



Many thanks to the 99 families who have brought us over the \$325,000 mark as we work toward our \$417,000 stewardship goal for the upcoming year; our journey is 78% completed. Pledge income is our largest source of operating income and represents almost two thirds of our annual operating budget. As church leadership leaps into the budget preparation process, they are making decisions on ministry and mission expenditures and are banking on this full pledge amount being available to support these Christian endeavors.

Building a budget requires some reliance on estimates and incomplete information, but the more concrete our income data can be, the more comfortable leadership becomes with the expense side of the equation. If you have not yet had the chance to submit your 2025 stewardship pledge, please take a minute to do so now. The budget team will be forever grateful!

NEW: Men's Spiritual Friendship Group January 31, 2025 at 7:AM

If you have been around the church for the last decade or so, you may have heard that we have a group called Men's Breakfast. These guys have been getting together for breakfast at a member's home once a month for a while now. As a frequent member of this group, I can say that it has been great fun.

Having said that, I would like to begin a more structured men's fellowship that actively tries to involve men who are newer to our congregation. The great joy of our church like ours is that people connect with others outside their age group or friend group.

Having said that, I also know that 95% of the men in our church do not read emails from the church and will not be reading this, so they will have no idea that I am reaching out to them. I am working with Ana Sanchez, our DCL, to find and set up a texting app to reach the 91 men on our membership roster. That's right, 91!

The fellowship will be breakfast based in Kraft Hall, on a recurring day every month. I will provide a reflection or conversation starter that is faith/life based beforehand so that we can really get to know each other, rather than just exchanging pleasantries and shooting the breeze (which is what already happens at Coffee Hour).

Knowing you men aren't reading this, you'll just have to keep your phones turned on for the text message soon coming to your inbox inviting you to this new friendship opportunity through our church.

Our first meeting will be on **January 31, 2025** at **7:AM**. We will be reaching out to you by text. If you would like to help with breakfast, please reach out to Max.

Resources for Hard Times

Most people probably think of church as listening to a sermon in Sunday service, singing in the choir, chatting with folks in coffee hour, Sunday School for the



Kids, Youth Group for the teens, and doing some good in the world.

Where else in life do you have a community that has people willing to do that with you.

Sometimes you really need a good lawyer,

therapist, psychiatrist, social worker, or a ride to AA. I can help you find those people... and I can go as a guest to AA as well.

All of this is a long way of saying – if you are in a rough patch, please let Kayla or me know. We are a judgment-free zone who are totally confidential with the sole hope of helping you find the healing and wholeness you need.
