News from Meeting House Hill

To the church of Jesus Christ in Dover:

May the peace of our Creator and the grace of our Lord be the rock on which you stand!

This has been the coldest winter we have had in many years. Not as much snow as I would have liked, but the pond ice has been great for skating.

So many people I know have started complaining about the winter: the cold, the dark, the wind, the continuity. "It gets right into your bones so you can't get warm. It goes on and on. Oh, to get away to the Caribbean to feel the sun!"

I myself love the winter. I find something so elemental about putting on three layers of running clothes and setting out with the dog before work first thing in the morning for a little 4-5 mile run around one of the local Trustees of Reservation Properties. The thermometer reads 19 degrees. The snow on the ground creates a stark clarity, with each sapling and blade of grass standing distinctly, where before it blended into a carpet of similarity. The red of the rising sun paints the treetops with an extravagant glow. Once I get into the flow and my body is warm, with just the front of my face exposed out of my hood, the crunch of snow under foot cushioning my stride where before it was all bumpy and hard rocks and tree roots.

Winter has much to offer us, even if it seems unpleasant in comparison with the other three seasons. Looking to the animals and trees who go inward this time of year, who go right to bare essentials to make it through, who depend upon this fallow time of hibernation to regenerate new life, we might be wise to think of the ways to use this season to clear away our spiritual clutter and recognize the essentials, allowing them to be our tap roots, our stored energy for the time when we emerge in the Spring.

I have been reading a truly delightful book called *Wintering*. *The power of rest and retreat in difficult times* by Katherine May. May delves into



The Annual Meeting is behind us, and officially, the new year has begun. New ideas have been floated and are being pursued. The "Good Church" that Max preached about last Sunday is taking shape here on Meeting House Hill in new twists on established programs and in new ways altogether - new ways to worship, new ways to welcome and embrace, new ways to connect kids with Jesus, and new ways to live our faith every day. Our church is as good as each and every one of us. A Few Updates on our Sponsored Guatemalan Refugee Family

In partnership with our sponsoring agency, Jewish Family Services of Metrowest, a small team of volunteers from The Dover Church has been providing support to the Marin Alvarez family since their arrival in the U.S.A. last March. Much has happened during that time, including the family's application being accepted last September for residency at a newly-renovated affordable housing apartment complex in Framingham, considerably lowering their monthly rental expenses.

Mom Zuly has recently found part-time employment at a neighborhood restaurant, while

Alejandro was able to have his worksite placement with the Framingham Public Schools food service reassigned to another FPS school located right across the street from their apartment.

Did you know?

"Refugees are forced migrants who have fled their home country to escape conflict, violence, or persecution and have sought safety in another country. Refugees who are approved to resettle to the U.S. undergo a rigorous vetting process including background and medical checks. They are granted refugee status prior to entering the country, so that upon entry, they immediately have legal rights and are on track to become permanent residents and eventually citizens, allowing them to rebuild their lives in safety and with dignity."
