SHARING THE BREAD AND CUP

Everyone is welcome to celebrate with us. You do not need to be a professing Christian, a member of this church, or even certain you know exactly what this is all about. Communion is about grace and blessing both of which depend upon God who welcomes you whoever and wherever you are. This morning, we are celebrating Communion by Intinction, (Latin for "dipping"), which means coming forward, as you are able, to be served. You will be offered bread (or a gluten free rice cake), which you can then dip into the wine or grape juice. If you are unable to come forward and would like to participate, please let our Deacons know and we will serve you in the pews. We will still say the traditional words, "The Body of Christ, broken for you," or "The Bread of Life," and "The Cup of Blessing." We encourage you to use the traditional response, "Amen" (Hebrew—"Let it be so.").

PRAYER OF THANKSGIVING

Thank you, O Holy One, for life in the Spirit of Jesus: for gladness in the bread and cup, for love that cannot die, for peace the world cannot give, for joy in the company of friends, for the glory of creation, and for the mission of justice you have made our own.

Give us the gifts of this Holy Communion: oneness of heart, love for neighbors, forgiveness of enemies, the will to serve you every day, and life that never ends. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.
