News from Meeting House Hill

To Christ's disciples who have been called to be the Church in Dover:

The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with all of you.

In less than a month now, Kayla and I will be leading nine teens from our youth group on a pilgrimage to Taizé (pronounced Taizay) in France, by way of several days hiking in Chamonix, also in France. This has been a dream of mine as long as I have been at The Dover Church, as it was just about the last thing I did in my last church. Sixteen years ago now, I took fourteen teens from Higganum and Haddam, CT, to Paris and Taizé. When I first mentioned this sort of trip as something I would like to bring to our community, it fell on deaf ears: "The Dover Church youth group is not religious. The senior minister is not involved in the youth group. The youth group always goes on work camp. Everyone has already been to France. Etc."

It is probably happening now because when I mentioned this as an idea to Kayla, she was very enthusiastic. The teens in our youth group love Kayla, so they want to go. And so, we're going. I am happy that there has been a change of heart.

Why Taizé? What's so special about Taizé? Taizé is an ecumenical monastic community in Burgundy that was founded after the Second World War with the intention of bringing young people from different countries together to foster peace and to promote youth discernment about the call of God in their lives. That alone should be enough of an answer.

However, when I arrived (I went first by myself to scout it out and then with the Higganum Congregational Youth Group) and found myself kneeling in a church surrounded by 6,000 young people from all over the world, singing psalms in different languages, listening to the youth Bible studies lead by the monks, watching young people interact and joyfully do the work of the monastery (cleaning, scrubbing, singing in the choir, etc.), participating in my own adult Bible study where we were asked to prayerfully consider questions like "what is God calling you to do with your life? How is God moving in your life? What scares you on your faith journey?" Well... the presence and power of the Holy Spirit was palpable. June 1, 2025
